

**12. ANSWERS FROM CLLR MARK BRADSHAW, EXECUTIVE MEMBER FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT**

Re Cycling City Project.

Q1. Who will be the stakeholder representatives be on the Cycling City Project Board?

A. The stakeholder representatives on the project board are Dr Hugh Annett, Director of Public Health and Peter Lipman, Policy Director, Sustrans.

Q2. What is the relationship between the route being developed in south Bristol for Cycling City and the proposed BRT route? Are they in any way dependent on each other?

A. The two projects are being worked up separately and are in no way dependant on each other. Where the same corridors are being investigated, options will be considered so that one project does not compromise the other.

Q3. What is the target date for the meeting with Bristol Parks Forum on the impact on Parks or Open Spaces?

A. We are very pleased to meet with BPF representatives as soon as they are available, but recognise that it will be some time before the capital programme is agreed to confirm the parks and green spaces that might benefit from the programme.

Q4. Is the meeting expected to be with the full BPF membership or with committee members and/or representatives of impacted parks and green spaces?

A. We would wish to meet with both the full BPF forum and committee members and/or representatives of impacted parks and green spaces.
