Directions to Redcatch Community Centre

In Redcatch Road, Knowle in South Bristol just 1 minute from A37 Wells Road about 5 minutes from Temple Meads Rail Station.

No 2 bus from city centre to Wells Road, 511 to Redcatch Road outside the centre from Brislington and Bedminster.

Close to Broadwalk Shopping Centre, Wells Road, where there is an a free multi-storey car park close to the community centre (use upper levels to avoid time limits). On street parking usually available in Redcatch Road.
