	PM stated that the Barton Hill Urban Park had been neglected for a number of weeks and the area looks untidy.	
	PC explained that the Park Keeper has been concentrating on the Bristol in Bloom sites but would discuss this issue with English Landscapes.	
	Following the meeting, EL confirmed that additional resource would be put in place to cover the Park Keeper.	PC
1.3	Cherry Tree in South Purdown	
	SF reported that the felling of a healthy cherry tree had upset residents and park users.	
	PC agreed discuss with the Natural Environment Team.	PC
	It was suggested that the Natural Environment Team put up notices informing local residents of planned work.	
	HH informed the forum that the Natural Environment Team do not have a budget for this.	
1.4	Malago Valley	
	AC complained that the system for reporting issues and problems was unclear and that the Community Parks Officer (CPO) for the South doesn't have capacity to deal with the volume of enquiries.	
	TM agreed to review the measures that were put in place to resolve the issues at this site.	
	TM also acknowledged comments that the CPO's do not have capacity to follow through all enquiries.	
	PC advised park groups to contact the contractors direct for urgent enquires due to the high volume of public enquiries received by the Community Parks Officers.

2.	Appointment of Project Officers	
	Project Officers will shortly be writing to park groups to introduce themselves and provide information on current and planned projects in the local area.	Project Officers
	TM confirmed that Project Officers are paid from S106 funds and therefore funding for this should be applied for with grants.	
3.	Section 106 update	
	TM stated that S106 funding is now being monitored closely to ensure that funds are spent within the necessary timescale. TM explained that going forward, it is likely that decisions regarding S106 funding will be considered by Neighbourhood Partnership's.

4.	Stoke Park	
	The process for transferring Stoke Park to Bristol City Council is underway.	
	Work to repair the wall will start in September after the bird nesting season. It is hoped that the land will come under BCC management in November 2010.	
	Concerns were raised about the anti-sociable behaviour at Stoke Park. This has been reported to Consortium and the emergency services but currently no one is taking ownership of the problems.	
5.	Grove Woods Local Nature Reserve	
	Cllr Hopkins informed the forum that BCC are currently undergoing a compulsory purchase order of Grove Woods Local Nature Reserve.	
	It was requested that the Natural Environment team inspect the site to check that the right trees are being felled.	NE team
6.	Stoke Lodge and use of school open spaces	
	DH advised the forum of plans to fence off Stoke Lodge Open Space.	
	Cllr Hopkins confirmed that there will be detailed discussions with the school before any developments take place.

12.2	How does the Council know which sites are low value? How is usage measured?	
	The following factors are considered:	
	- criteria set out in the PGSS e.g. importance for wildlife, use to a school, historic importance, etc	
	- level of use - through on site assessment, feedback from operations team and through public consultation	
	RF agreed to provide park groups with a copy of assessments if requested.	
12.3	Will BCC consider increasing public access to green spaces such as school grounds and housing sites in areas that are under provided for?	
	This needs to be considered by the planning department when development takes place or through negotiation with existing landowners.	
12.4	How will the AGSP make judgements from public feedback?	
	The PGSS project board will compare public comments against the AGSP criteria and initial analysis of the site.	
	The PGSS project board will then put forward recommendations to Cabinet for consideration.	
12.4	Will sites in the inner city that lack green space be considered for disposal?	
	RF confirmed that disposal would only be considered if there was the possibility to swap land that offered better recreational use.	
	It was noted that this is not clear in the AGSP.	
12.5	Will the Council consider investing in acquisitions rather than enhancement of existing sites?	
	RF and Cllr Hopkins confirmed that money from disposals could possibly be spent on acquiring land rather than enhancing existing space.	
	However, RF stated that research has shown that improving the quality of green spaces increases usage rather than quantity.	
12.6	Ashton Vale Developments	
	Ashton Vale Heritage Group raised concerns about the lack of consultation on developments in the area.	
	HH agreed to draft a letter to Cabinet raising concerns about the development of a stadium and arena on green belt land in Ashton Vale.	НН
