	It was noted that at least 1 member of the group will have to have undertaken the health & safety training for volunteers otherwise a Council Officer will need to be present.	
	Groups participating should contact Denise James who is coordinating the weekend. Denise will then arrange for Clean and Green to collect rubbish from agreed locations on Monday morning.	
4.2	Dog Fouling Campaigns	
	AC shared anti-dog fowling posters with the Forum that have had a positive effect in Malago Valley. For copies, please contact AC.	
	It was noted that Keep Britain Tidy also provide posters free of charge.	
4.3	Stoke Park	
	SE noted that there has been a significant decrease in anti-social behaviour incidents in Stoke Park since BCC ownership.

5.1.2	If current features aren't being maintained as suggested by some members, this should be reported to the Parks department. Works will then be prioritised by the 'fix it' team.	
5.2	Maintenance Contractors Performance	
	RS acknowledged that there were a few issues with grass cutting at the start of the season but these were quickly resolved. However, in general it's been a good start to the season.	
5.3	'Fix it' team - availability, programme of Work	
	The 'Fix it' team work across the city, including the contract areas, priortising health and safety works.	
5.4	Allocation of £3.5m for Bristol's Parks	
	£3.5m capital investment is available for parks and open spaces this year. Local Councillors need to submit bids by 24 <sup>th</sup> April based on consultation with Park Groups and through NP's.	
	The Parks department will then review and prioritise bids in relation to the AGSP's and strategic priorities before submitting proposals to Cabinet in June.	
	Concerns were raised that some Councillors may not put through park groups recommendations. It was therefore agreed that the deadline could be extended to 30 <sup>th</sup> April so that Park Groups could discuss with their local Councillors.
