1.	P&GSS Cross Party Working - update on process	
1.1	Currently all parties are meeting on a weekly basis to review the PGSS process. The group are planning to produce a public statement on their progress in September.	
	Cllr RS suggested that the BPF should be involved in agreeing the general principles of the strategy but shouldn't comment on the decision making process for individual sites.	
	HH stated that he agreed with this and was happy with the way in which the group were working together.	
	Cllr RS confirmed that as part of the process the group will be reviewing petitions.	
	The forum also requested that sites that were withdrawn from disposal list are not reviewed again and are protected for the next 20 years.	
	The Avon Wildlife Trust will be invited to a future meeting to discuss SNCI sites.	
2.	Proposed Additions to P&GSS Land	
	Cllr GH provided an update on the following sites:	
2.1	Stoke Park	
	BCC are currently liaising with Brandon Trust to finalise the acquisition but at present the timescale for completion is not known.	
2.2	Grove Wood	
	The Council will consider a Compulsory Purchase Order following a decision on the application for Town Village Green status.	
2.3	Stoke Lodge	
	There are plans to transfer the management of land from Education to Parks.	
	There is currently an application for town village green status. Cllr GH advised that applying for Town Village Green Status is not necessarily the best course of action as it restricts the future use of the land.	
	There is also a request to issue TPO's on all trees at Stoke Lodge. This will protect them against future developments. However, it is Council policy the TPO's are not put on Council owned trees. The Tree Forum are currently working to resolve this issue.	
3.	Castle Park	
	The BPF requested that Cllr Simon Cook retracts the statement he made at the Cabot and Clifton East NP meeting that "The improvement of Castle Park is dependent on, and won't happen

	without, the development at St Mary le Port" as this is against the principles of the P&GSS.	
	The BPF oppose any developments to Castle Park particularly because the area is deficit of green space (although the NP boundary doesn't truly reflect this).	
	It was also noted that the depot should also considered as part of the park.	
	A few members at the meeting were disappointed that the matter couldn't be discussed in more detail. However, it was decided that a separate meeting would be arranged following plans from the developers.	
4.	Wild City Project	
4.1	PS gave a presentation on the Wild City Project.	
	It is a 3 year project funded by the Big Lottery and managed by Natural England. The aim of the project is to link communities, particularly people that are less likely/ unable to enjoy natural environment to their local parks and nature reserves.	
	Details of the Wild River Festival were provided along with Wild City maps that show walking trails between the sites.	
	Members of the forum requested more notice about such events.	
5.	Bristol Parks Update	
5.1	<u>Haycuts</u>	
	PC apologised that wild flower meadows were cut too early in Badocks Woods and Old Sneed Park and that park groups weren't informed prior to work starting.	
	PC explained that unfortunately the contractor was provided with incorrect dates. The dates will now be reviewed and re-issued to the contractor. It has also been agreed that going forward the contractor will obtain authorisation from the team leader prior to accessing the site.	
	It forum questioned whether this work could be carried out in-house but PC explained that neither the in-house teams or contractors have the necessary tools/ equipment to carry out this work.	
	Northern Slopes commented that they were pleased with the way in which Quadron consulted them with regards to the hay cut.
