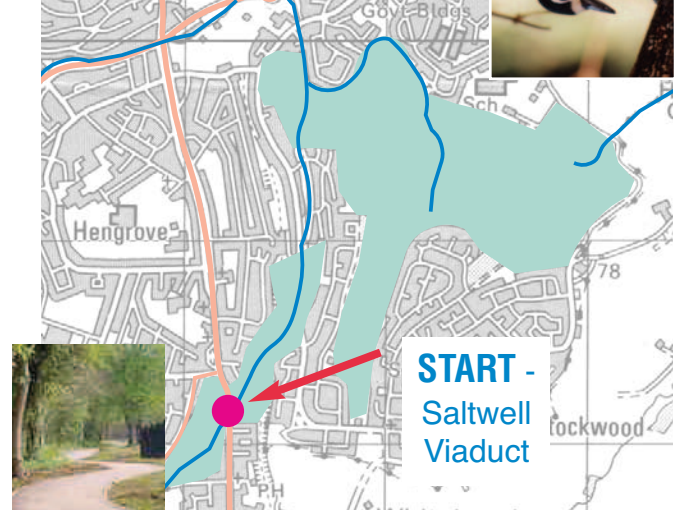
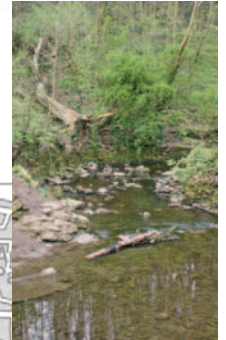
The Brislington Brook Trek will take you to areas of our city that you have probably never visited before!
