During detailed discussion of the sites for consideration the following points were highlighted:

- The Partnership noted that Ne ighbourhood Committees had been delegated the authority to make decision on the retention, declaring of being surplus to requirements or deferring a decision on the parks and open spaces in their area;
- Several resident expressed concern at possible impact for the parks and open spaces strategy on of any decision made on the land at Ashton Vale;
- Councillor Stone commented that all though he had chaired the Cross Party Working Group that he had not endorsed the proposals relating to funding which were being considered by Neighbourhoo d Partnership;
- Members were asked to conf irm the previous decision of the Neighbourhood Partnership and Committee that Lodge Hill Open space be retained;

This was moved by Councillor Comer and seconded by Councillor Hassell, and

RESOLVED:

- (i) that the Neighbourhood Partnership/Committee endorse proposals to retain Lodge Hill as space.
- Several residents set out reasons for retaining the remaining parks and open spaces for consideration as parks and green spaces.

Councillor Comer moved the proposal, which was seconded by Councillor Hassell,

That the decision on the disposal of Snowdon Road, be deferred to 2017

Upon being put to the vote this was LOST, 2 voting for the motion and 4 voting against.

Councillor Alexander moved the propos als, which was seconded by Councillor Khan, and

RESOLVED:

(i) that Delabere Avenue, part of Gill Avenue, Bracey Drive, part of Duchess Way and Snowdon Road all be retained as parks and open spaces as appropriate.

10. PARK INVESTMENT PLAN AND CLEAN AND GREEN SPENDS

The Neighbourhood Partnership received a report of Denise James, City Development and Neighbourhoods (Agenda Item No. 10).

The Partnership not ed that the Gr eater Fishponds Ar ea Neighbourhood Committee agreed the Parks Investm ent Plan at the Neighbourhood Partnership meeting on 8 th December 2011. The Neighbourhood Committee requested that further be undertaken on the provisional plan to establish further prioritisation of projects, and to develop cost s for the prioritised projects, these works to be carried out jointly by the Neighbourhood Environment Officer and Environment Sub Group.

The Neighbourhood Committee also agre ed at the meeting to set aside £50,000 of the Parks Section 106 to support quick wins and to delegate responsibility to process up to £2,500 by the Area Environment Officer with close collaboration with the Environment Sub Group. This would allow for park groups to apply for quick win projects, with a condition to ensure that the money is used on capital investment that is sustainable.

It was anticipated that should the works be approved that they w ould be undertaken in approximately 8 weeks, following a start date.

Councillor Hassell moved the recommendations as set out in the report, which was seconded by Councillor Stevenson, and

RESOLVED:

- (1) that the Neighbourhood Committee agrees the S106 spend of £14,006.08 for the 135 Charlton Road, Speedwell development. To improve access to Coombe Brook The Gozzie, due to recent intensification of use by Chester Park Infant School, for Forest School activities. (As set out in Appendix 1 of the report)
- (2) that the Neighbourhood Committee agree the recommendation from the Environment Sub Group to also spend a small part of the allocated £19,355.57 for Manor Rd, Fishponds development, if the proposed works are more than the £14,006.08.
- (3) that the Neighbourhood Committee notes that it is a requirement that the £14,006.08 has to be spent by 24th July 2012, or the funds will no longer be available.
- (4) that the Neighbourhood Committee note the seven S106 Quick Win locations recommended by the Environment Sub Group. (As set out in Appendix 2 of the report)
- (5) that the Neighbourhood Committee agree the spend for the Clean & Green devolved budget, as recommended by the Environmental Sub Group. (As set out in Appendix 3 of the report)

The Partnership expressed thanks to Denise James, for the work already undertaken in improving the environment in the Greater Fishponds Area, through the work undertaken by the Team.

11. DEVOLVED TRANSPORT SCHEMES FOR 2012/13

The Neighbourhood Partnership received a report of Shaun Taylor, Area Manager, Highways and Traffic, Transport Services (agenda item no. 11) relating to the dev olved transport budgets available to the Greater Fishponds Neighbourhood Partnership.

The Partnership noted the impact fo r the Highways Section following the reorganisation of the City Deve lopment and the Neighbourhoods Departments of the City Council, and that S haun Taylor, had bee n appointed Area Manager cover the Greater Fishponds Area.
