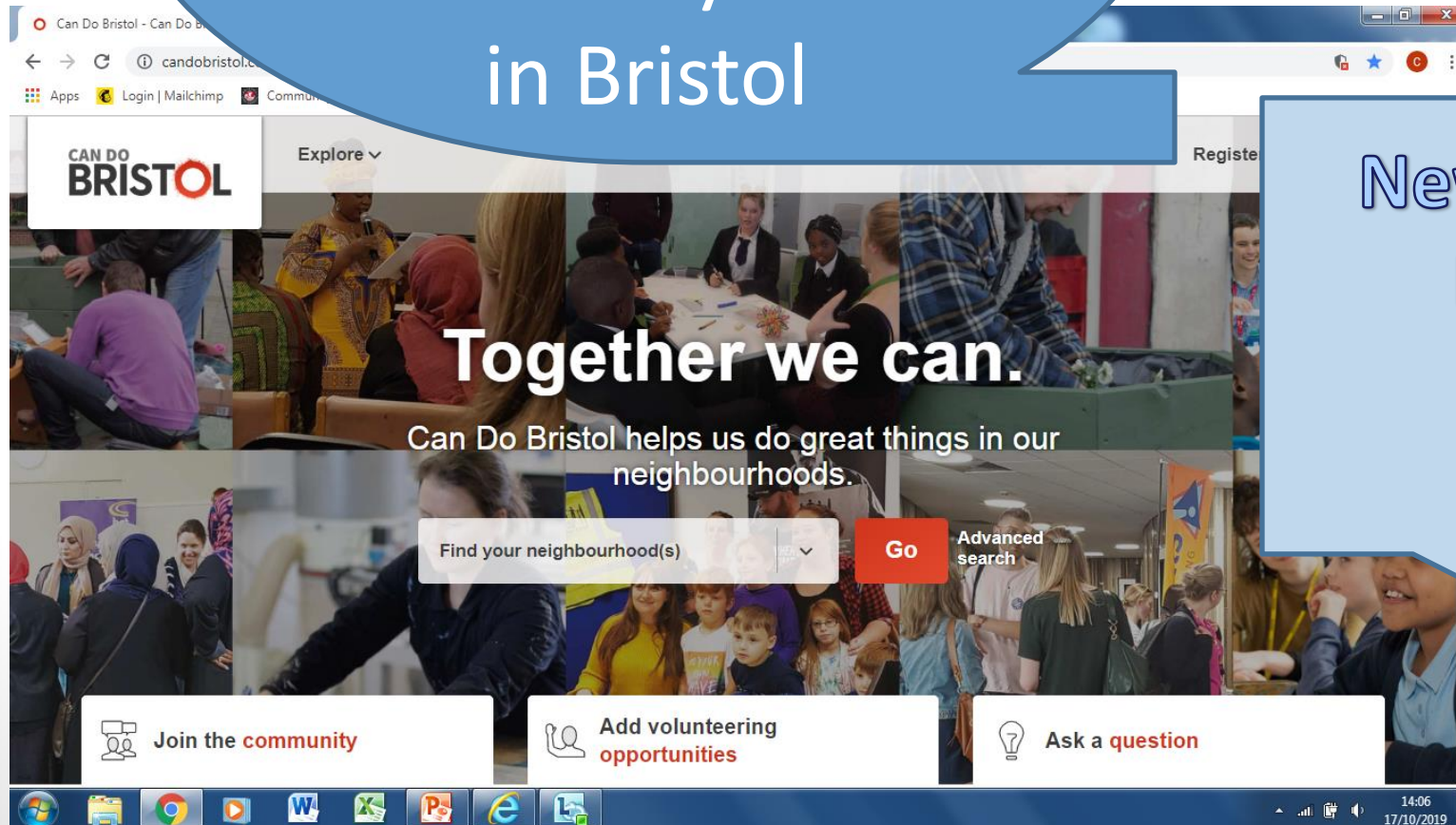

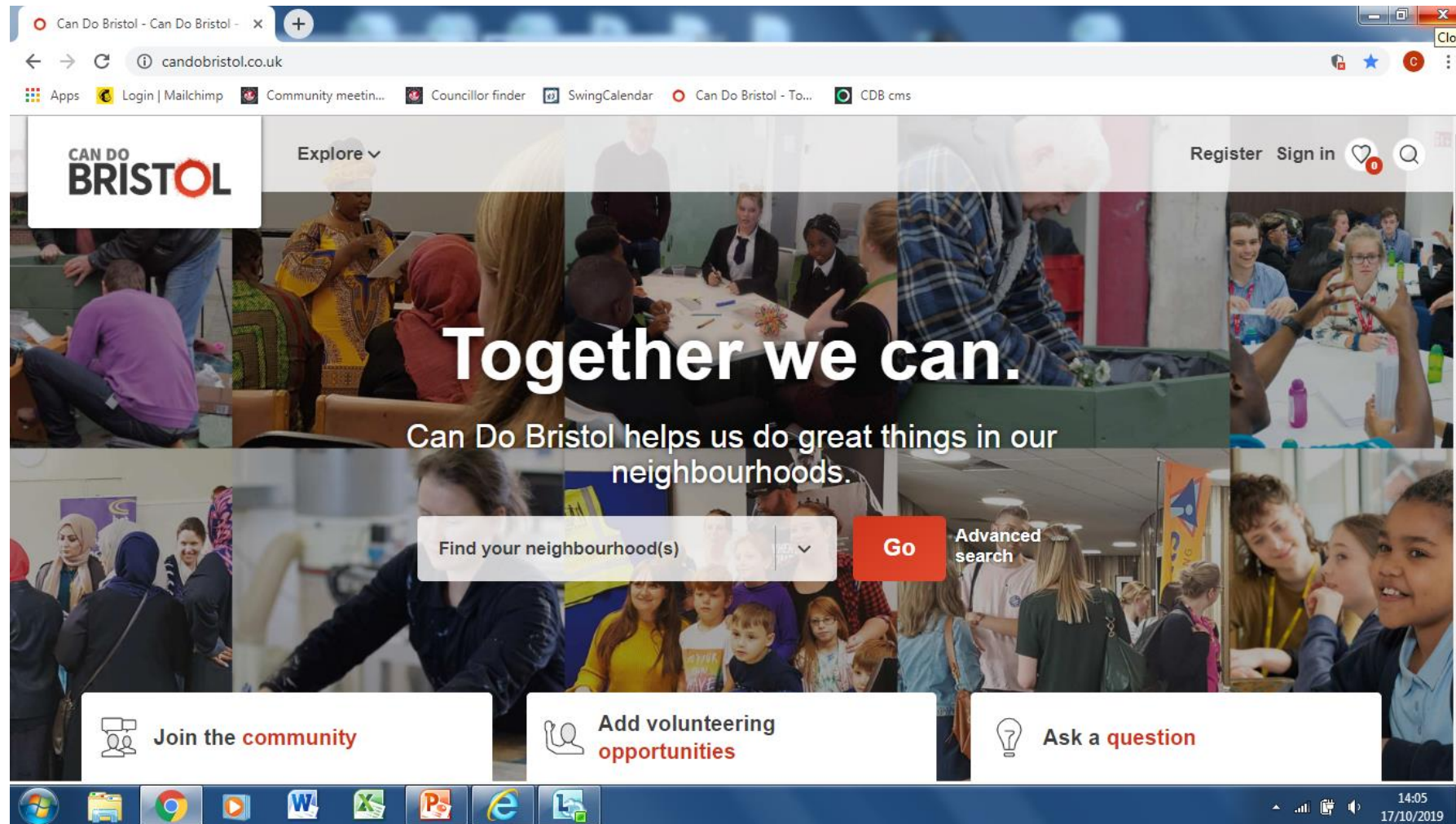

To make community action more accessible, we have opened the website, Can-Do Bristol, a digital platform designed purely for communities to help themselves, connecting people and businesses to projects looking for help.

The [Bristol Reading in Schools](#) project alone has successfully crowdsourced 250 volunteers to help children from years 1, 2 and 3 (5, 6 and 7 year olds) who have fallen behind with their reading. Volunteers from across our wonderful city commit many days to improving children's confidence and overall reading skills, and encourage a love of reading.



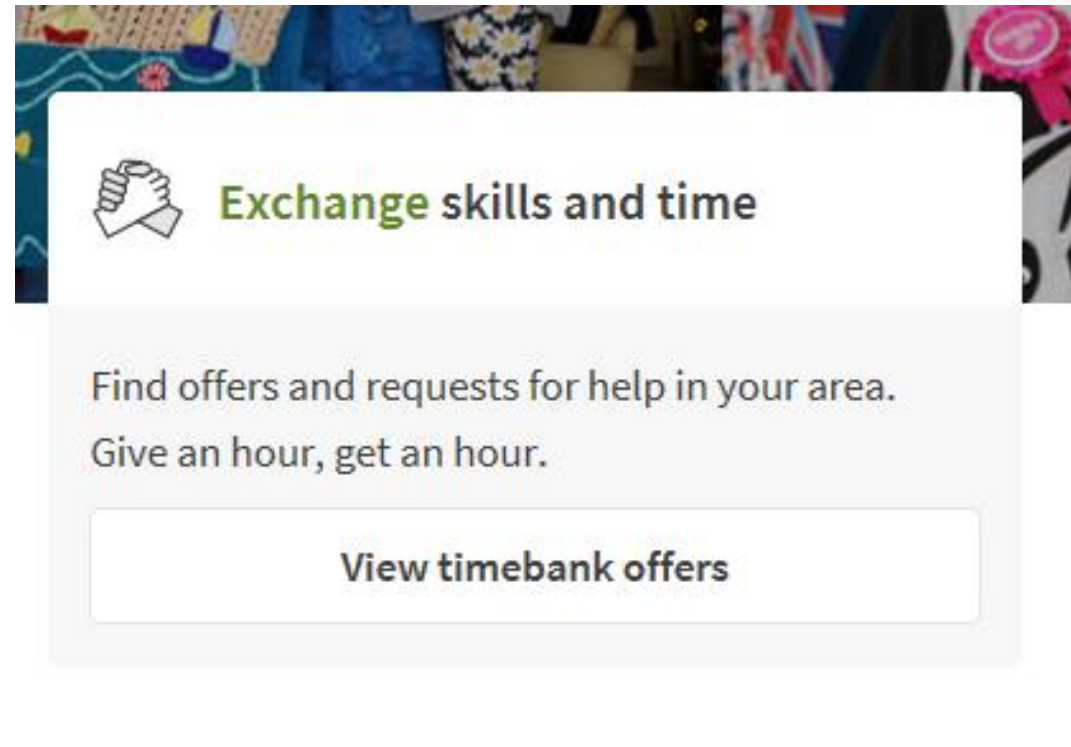
