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### Area Green Space Plans Update

The campaign is to save open countryside around Bristol and in West of England and to oppose the proposed urban extensions and other large scale developments. 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#### Consultations

After the six week break because of the local elections there will now be another rush of consultations, many of which will impact on Bristol's parks & green spaces. In the coming weeks there will be more on the Knowle West Regeneration and the further consultation on the

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#### **Bristol Development Framework**

As I mentioned in my last email the latest consultation on the BDF <a href="www.bristol.gov.uk/bdf">www.bristol.gov.uk/bdf</a> is on the 'Core Strategy Draft Development Principles Paper'. Of particular interest to park groups will be the policy on 'Green Infrastructure' but there are also several other policies that will impact on parks and green spaces. The consultation runs until 17 July so please make your voice heard and take part in the consultation. There is a community involvement event tomorrow (Thurs) and I shall let you know anything significant that comes out of that in a future email.

The Bristol Development Framework is supposed to be following the Regional Spacial Strategy (RSS), the latest version of which is the one that has suggested a big increase in housing numbers and building on Green Belt (see <a href="https://www.saveourgreenspaces.org">www.saveourgreenspaces.org</a>). According today's report in the Evening Post <a href="http://tinyurl.com/m5ofv9">http://tinyurl.com/m5ofv9</a> the final version of the RSS will be delayed, perhaps for sometime. We wait to see what impact this will have on the timetable for the BDF.
