Ping! Bristol is an exciting table tennis initiative that will be in Bristol, 29th June to 27th July 2012. Bristol residents will see ping-pong tables popping up in various locations from city centre open spaces to outside museums and restaurants.

Ping! Bristol will see:

46 Tables available for free play for 1 month – July 2012. (25 temporary event tables, 15 new concrete tables and 6 existing park tables). Each event table comes with a daily supply of bats and balls.

Ping! activities based on the tables as well as at community venues

(These could include Ping Parties and picnics, DIY bat making sessions, Film Ping, Master Classes, Ping for Beginners)
