Keep Britain Tidy has been managing the Love Parks Week campaign for over a year now and due to the success of securing Big Lottery funding we are now in a position to redevelop and expand the project into a year round brand...

Love Parks.

Headed up by Anthea Thomas, Love Parks Manager, this new project seeks to address the imminent threat to parks and green spaces by maximising the roles of volunteers and community groups. We will be working towards ensuring all community groups involved in parks and green spaces are:

- Equipped with the resources they need to generate and then represent increased community interest in local green spaces
- Provide effective advocacy to influence decision making
- Contribute to the management and maintenance of spaces and, where appropriate, acquire responsibility and control of these spaces

As part of the project aims, Love Parks will be working with the National Federation of Parks and Green Space to create a national network and a campaigning voice for the thousands of friends groups across the country.

These groups will be mentored and supported through our Network and Training Coordinator.

There is a lot of work to be done and the project will be looking to work with you all to help achieve these goals. Over the coming months you will begin to see a number of changes, work is already underway for a brand new Love Parks site which will feature much more resources, access to training and networking opportunities as well as promoting and advocating Love Parks Week and its associated events.

We will also be in touch from time to time to carry out research. Your feedback and comments are vital to the strength and outreach of this project. Only with your support can we deliver on our commitments and ensure that everyone has access to clean, safe accessible parks and green spaces.

Dear Friend of Bristol's Trees – You are invited to the TreeForum meeting on Monday 6th Oct at

6pm. Members of the public and representatives of community organisations, it is really important you flex your democratic muscles and come if you can!

At this meeting we will be understanding the reality following the implementation of 30% cuts to the tree department's revenue budget. Separately, Jon Clark, Director of the Forest of Avon Trust has done a study valuing some of the benefits of trees in North Somerset (£1.7m per annum). We will review the PiPS (Trees in Schools) program, also the revived TreeBristol (street trees program) and are continuing with our approach for sustainable external funding once the PiPS program is over. The John Muir Trust is the leading UK conservation charity dedicated to protecting wild places. We own and care for some of the UK's finest wild landscapes including Ben Nevis, Schiehallion, Sandwood Bay, Quinag in Assynt, part of the Cuillin on Skye and 3,000 acres on the remote Knoydart peninsula.

Founded in 1983, the Trust takes its inspiration from John Muir (1838-1914), the Scots-born founder of the modern conservation movement. Like Muir, the Trust believes in protecting wild land for its own sake – and because we believe wild places are essential for people and wildlife.

This year the JMT Chief Executive, Stuart Brooks, will give an update on developments over the past year before leading a discussion on the Trust's plans for its work in England and Wales. Our Head of Land and Science, Mike Daniels, together with John Stowers, South West England Deer Liaison Officer, and Charles Harding, Secretary of the Exmoor and District Deer Management Society, will enlighten us further on the challenges of deer management in both Scotland and the South West.

We also hope to welcome back a talented, local young photographer this year to wow us with another fabulous show - details to follow so keep an eye on the web page.

There will also be an opportunity to join in with an optional pub supper on the Saturday evening and Wild Bristol Walk on the following Sunday morning.
