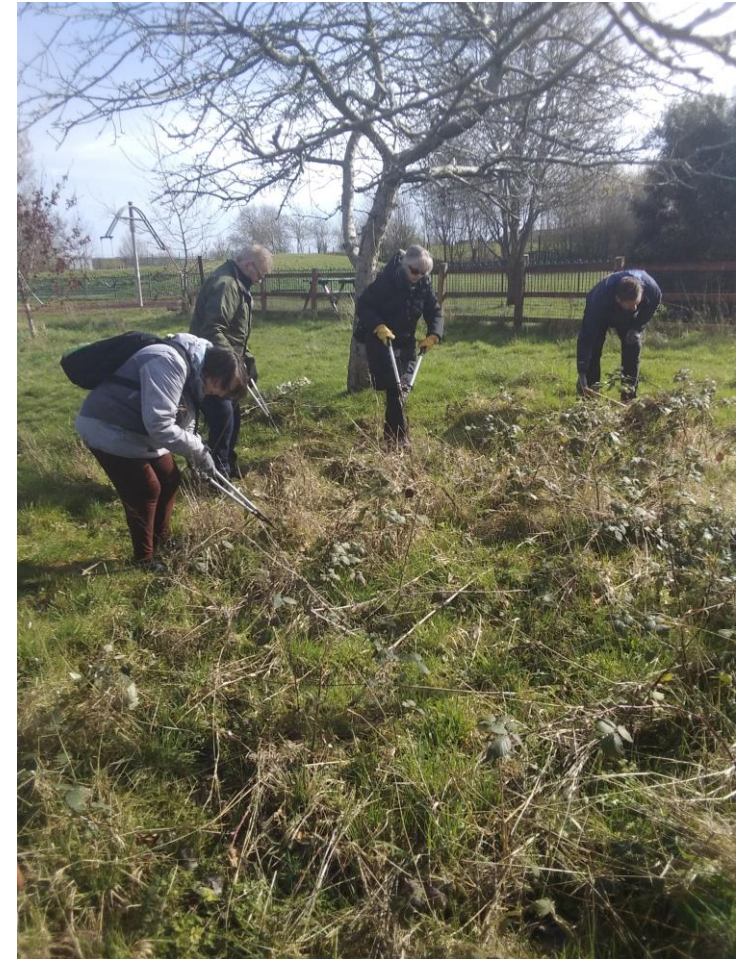


Wild & Well (Bristol)

- Wild & Well has now expanded from Hartcliffe, to Withywood and Stockwood
- Held network meetings in each area (network has over 60 people)
- Identified Community Champions to promote park opportunities

Roots to Wellbeing – Bristol

- Continuing to deliver Roots to Wellbeing in Eastville Park & Hartcliffe Millennium Green
- Secured £220k from National Lottery Community Fund to expand to Withywood and Stockwood over the next 2-years from May 2023
- Working with Bristol Natural History Consortium for the programme evaluation and exploring options to bring in academics to evidence health benefits



UKSPF

- Secured a partnership bid with BCC from WECA Levelling Up fund - £180k over 3 years
- Project will focus on supporting community action to make nine parks in South Bristol more biodiverse and inclusive
- Will be recruiting 2 new posts, 1 will be providing some administrative support to Ella
- Some funding for South Bristol community groups available too

Accessibility Guides

- One of the biggest barriers to visiting parks is the lack of reliable information available
- Developed an Accessibility Guide template for groups to complete and publicise
- Ran workshop at Park Group Get Together
